### Mission trip to Haiti

#### MSCC & CARHA Mission

I had always heard the statistics: Haiti is the poorest country in the western hemisphere. I had always heard the stories of the difficult conditions of the Haitians. I had seen the photos of the devastation of Port au Prince after the earthquake. Now I know, not because I have heard, but because I have seen with my own two eyes.

Christian Action and Relief for Haiti (CARHA) is doing great ministry of service to the people of Haiti. It is directed by Djumy Septembre. Djumy grew up in the small village of Bayonnais outside of Gonaives, Haiti. He was sponsored by brother Wyburn Osborne to attend Port au Prince Bible College, and later finished his degree at Mid-South Christian College. After finishing his degree at Mid-South he began to return to Haiti to help his home villages and people. CARHA now operates 5 schools (in mountain of Bayonnais, Saint Martin - known as Karley Pope school, in Passe-reine in the valley of Douin, and in the mountain of Terre-neuve), an orphanage in the mountain of Bayonnais a medical clinic in Saint Martin and supports 5 churches in the villages around Gonaives (Bayonnais, Saint Martin, Passe- Reine, Douin and Terre- neuve).

We were privileged to visit three of the churches, the orphanage, the clinic, and two of the schools. We also worked alongside Haitian workers to build the foundation for a cafeteria for the school at Saint Martin.

For, Bradley and Joseph, it was their first time out of the United States. They responded well to the different conditions and participated in all the activities. It was good to have Ronnie Hoyer, experienced missionary, with us as well as Don Seiler, experienced builder. Each used their expertise to add to the team effort. One reason that I am impressed with CARHA is that it is run totally by Haitians and it is making an impact on all the major needs of the people of Haiti who struggle with poverty, hunger, and pagan religions. Please continue to remember the work of all of our missions in Haiti as they deal with the needs of that country.
